

Hanging Baskets for Sun & Shade

If you are planning to buy a hanging basket for yourself, or as a gift, there are a few things you should consider before you buy.

First, decide how much time you have to care for it. If you're away every weekend, choose something that doesn't require a lot of care. Second, choose the right plant for the right location. There are plants for every light requirement, and placing a plant in an area with either too much sun or too little sun will be discouraging at best. Third, remember that baskets and containers need a little more attention (read "water") than flowers planted in the ground - they do not have access to the moisture that bedded plants do.

All of the hanging baskets that we sell have been supplemented with a time release fertilizer pellet to make them easier to care for.

Hanging baskets and container plantings of flowering plants are a wonderful way to decorate porches, decks, and patio areas during the summer months. With a little thought and planning, they will be easy to care for and will bloom continuously until the fall frost.

Bacopa	X	X		Pruning not needed to maintain flowering. Available in Moss Basket!
Fuschia		X	X	Very showy flowers, rich colors. Available in Moss Basket!
Impatiens		X	X	Water sparingly. Bright colors for a shady spot.
Ivy Geranium	X	X		Very hardy plant. Available in Moss Basket!
Lobelia		X	X	Water frequently. Avoid windy areas. Small plentiful blooms.
Million Bells	X	X		Miniature petunia flowers with a cascading habit.
New Guinea Impatiens	X	X		Water frequently.
Non Stop Begonias		X	X	Water sparingly.
Pansy/Viola	X	X		Great for April/Early May color. Available in Moss Basket!
Scaevola	X	X		Loves the heat. Available in Moss Basket!
Supertunia	X	X		Vigorous cascading petunia. Showy. Available in Moss Basket!
Thunbergia	X	X		Water frequently; climbs & trails.

Sun: Full day of sun is the best but it will grow in half day of sun.

Part Sun: Half a day of sun or filtered sunlight.

Shade: Plant thrives in an area outdoors which receives half day of sun or very little sunlight.
